Motion to the Faculty Senate (1-2-24)

Background:

- The current assumes employment with the University.
- With the sale of the clinical practice (SLUCare) many individual faculty who are part of the clinical practice are no longer employed by SLU.
- The rights and privileges of clinical faculty not employed by the University are not well described by the current
- Non-SLU employed individuals with faculty appointments within the SOM should have access to a manual that accurately describes their roles, responsibilities, protections, and privileges.
- The SOM's clinical faculty members support having a clinical faculty manual. [based on polling]

Therefore, the SOM's clinical faculty requests the Faculty Senate's approval to:

- 1. Create a separate, stand-alone clinical faculty manual that will accurately describe the rights and privileges of individuals not employed by the University who hold faculty appointments within the SOM.
- 2. Allow the SOM clinical faculty body in conjunction with the Dean of SOM, the Provost, the President of the University, and the Board of Trustees to describe a process to handle the development, approval, and future amendments to a SOM clinical faculty manual.
